

Julian Charles Arthur Sacher Scholarship

Julian Sacher was the son of Superintendent Kurt Sacher who passed away suddenly at the age of 27 on April 1, 2019. Julian is remembered for his rapier-like wit and his keen sense of humor along with his perseverance through difficult times. In June of 2017 Julian suffered from a fall which left him with a severe brain and spinal cord injury. After 4 months and 5 days in the Calgary Foothills hospital Julian made a remarkable recovery with respect to his brain. Unfortunately, he remained paralyzed and was never able to walk again. In spite of his injuries, Julian was able to return to full independence and he did return to his studies in his 3rd and final year of medical school just prior to his death. Because of Julian the University of Calgary now has detailed protocols for doctors in wheelchairs to be successful.

Julian is remembered for his kindness and his care of others, his amazing sense of humor, and his deep commitment to medicine.

The \$1500 Julian Charles Arthur Sacher Scholarship will be administered to one Chinook's Edge High School Student based on the following criteria:

- a) An average of 80% in all grade 12 diploma level subjects.
- b) A convincing 500-word essay on why you are interested in science and what you plan on doing in the future with a Bachelor of Science degree.
- c) Evidence of care and concern for fellow classmates (reference letters).
- d) Evidence of a particularly strong sense of humor (reference letters).
- e) Registered in a Bachelor of Science program.
- f) Must be attending a post-secondary institution within 2 years of graduating.

Special consideration will be given for the following

- a) The student has a disability.
- b) The student has a demonstrated financial need.
- c) The student is interested in going into Medicine in the future.
- d) The student is devoted to gaming.
- e) The student is attending a Canadian University.
