- Intensive training in movement, physical theatre and stage fighting; voice, speech, text analysis, dialect, singing; and immersion in a wide range of acting styles including acting for the camera with particular focus on classical/period/extended text.
- Study with a range of teachers, coaches, and directors including top-rated faculty, MFA directors and theatre professionals from the outside community.
- Preparation for immediate entry into the professional workforce, including extensive audition preparation for both and stage and film .

You Will Learn:

- Physical and vocal flexibility and stamina to tackle any style of playing in today's theatre.
- Theoretical and critical analysis of contemporary and classical texts, and then a variety of approaches to make them come alive.
- A solid and varied practice that develops all the actor's tools to create a centered, intuitive and exciting on-stage presence.
- How to create a vibrant character with extended physical, psychological, imagistic, and vocal qualities.
- How to fill the stage and reach the audience in a variety of performance spaces.
- How to work in an ensemble to ensure respect for the work, the partner and the self.

If you are in Grade 12, we encourage you to **audition** in February 2025. If you are selected, we will guarantee a spot for you to enter the 3-year BFA Acting program in Fall 2026. You can still choose to do your 1st year (referred to as pre-professional year) here at the U of A, or you can choose to do it at a different post-secondary institution as long as the credits transfer into the U of A. If you are selected you will also receive close mentorship if you choose to complete your pre-professional year at the U of A.

Applicants to any BA program require an average that is competitive for the given year on 5 eligible high school subjects, as follows.

Academic Admission Requirements:

- English 30-1
- Four other eligible 30 level subjects
- Of these four subjects, a maximum of one eligible 30-level Fine Arts course may be used
- Of these five classes, no mark can be below 50%
- Your admission average will automatically be calculated on the 5 highest grades that meet these requirements

Pre-Professional Year

All applicants must have completed, or be enrolled in, a minimum of 21 credits of university or college courses that are transferable to the Faculty of Arts at the University of Alberta, at the time of application.

Where should I complete my minimum 1 year of preprofessional study?

Start where you want to finish - take your 1 year here at the UofA in the BA Drama program. It is a strong program in and of itself. There also won't be any issues with course transferability. You may take your courses at another college or university, as long as they transfer.
